

Testing and Tracing Summary

Once in school, any staff member experiencing symptoms will be sent home. Once in school, any student experiencing symptoms will be sent to the nurse. If symptoms cannot be attributed to any specific cause other than COVID-19, the student will be sent home and be required to quarantine for 14 days and engage in remote-only schooling. A student that needs to be picked up by a parent will wait in the isolation room, monitored by a staff member, until the parent arrives. If the school nurse is not available, they shall be sent home or isolated until the school nurse is available.

In order to return to school after showing symptoms, the student/staff member must meet the criteria of the Return to School Protocol which can include any of the following three scenarios:

- Individual showing symptoms received a positive COVID-19 test AND
- Isolated for 10 days AND
- Presents clearance from a healthcare provider AND
- The individual has been symptom free for 24 hours without the use of medication.

OR

- Individual showing symptoms received a negative COVID-19 test AND
- Presents clearance from a healthcare provider AND
- The individual has been symptom free for 24 hours without the use of medication.

OR

- Individual never got a COVID-19 test AND
- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms started AND
- Presents clearance from a healthcare provider AND
- The individual has been symptom free for 24 hours without the use of medication.

Any student or staff member that receives a positive test will be required to switch to remote only school and quarantine for 10 days. These individuals must also follow the Return to School Protocol as outlined above. All students and staff in that same Year (i.e. Year 1, Year 2 or Year 3) as the student or staff member who receives a positive test will switch to remote only school for 14 days. In addition:

- UD Team will consult with NYCDOH and NYC Trace to determine who, additionally, is an "exposed" individual and must stay out of school.
- UD Team will cooperate with the NYC's Test and Trace Corp. program and any other mandates required by the NYCDOH
- UD Team will work with the NYCDOH to determine what conditions (i.e. number of positive COVID-19 cases in the building) would trigger a full school closure and the amount of time of the closure.

UD Team must notify the state and the local health department immediately upon being informed of any positive COVID-19 diagnostic test result by an individual within the

school facility or on school grounds, including students, faculty, staff and visitors. UD Team will work with local and state contact tracing programs as required.

If UD Team students and staff need access to large-scale testing, the school will follow directions from NYCDOH regarding where testing should happen and communicate that information to the school community.
