Hearing Details & Purpose: The New York State Education Department Board of Regents (Board of Regents), in its capacity as a charter authorizer, has received an application to renew and revise a charter contract.

Urban Dove Charter School is a charter school located at 1256 East 21 Street, Brooklyn, NY 11210 in Community School District (“CSD”) 22. Urban Dove Team Charter School II is a charter school located at 860 Forest Avenue, Bronx, NY 10456 in Community School District (“CSD”) 7.

Under the proposed revision, Urban Dove Charter School and Urban Dove Team Charter School II would amend their school’s mission and vision as detailed below effective immediately.
